Supplies & Costs

Required supplies: Pay office \$40 art fee, sketchbook, and pencil. As an aspired artist, it is encouraged to start buying your own art supplies, but not required. The cost to submit work for review is approximately \$90.

Class Overview

- O AP Studio Art sets a national standard in the visual arts that contributes a significant role to the academic environment, while allowing students to earn college credit and/or advanced placement while in high school. AP courses address quality of student work and the student's concentration on a particular interest or visual problem
- O College AP credit is not earned by taking the class. That will come as a result of passing a test which comes in May. The test consists of a review of the students work by a panel of judges at Princeton University who will look at approximately 30 pieces of the students work. Scores range from 1-6. A score of 3 or better constitutes a passing grade which results in 12 hours of college credit. This is worth \$600-\$2000 (depending on the university). The cost to submit work for review is approximately \$90.
- o All AP art students will be expected to complete a portfolio for submission. Only artwork that has been completed while in high school will be accepted for portfolio submission.
- o Portfolio requirement for AP Studio Art (earning college credit):
 - o 12 Breadth Art Works: experience in the formal, technical, and expressive means of the artist.
 - o 12 Concentration Art works: 12 unified art pieces, but each art piece is different.
 - o 5 actual works of quality: Matte 5 of your best art pieces to send
 - o Written commentary: artist statement
 - o Portfolios are scored from a one to a six; three and above is a passing score. Always shoot for a 6!

Expectations

Respectful Responsible Professional

- Respectful: Treat me, peers & others with kindness & treat supplies with care. Listen attentively.
- o **Responsible**: Respond to expectations throughout the semester.
- o **Professional:** Be polite, be on task & strive for excellence
 - <u>Digital devices:</u> Do not use digital devices when I or peers are expecting your attention. You may use digital devices during work time for art class purposes; these include: 1. Reference a photo to observe for your art, 2. Listen to music while you work on art, 3. Look up information for this class.
 - Student's Art Work: Keep content & artwork appropriate for High School. If it requires censorship or censorship is questionable, don't create it. Keep ideas original and creative; Don't copyright.

- o <u>Missing work</u>: If an assignment is on the portal as worth 0 points and shows as missing, this is a reminder to you that the assignment will be due soon. The assignment will be worth more when it is due.
- Assignments: worth based on approximately 1 minute effort = 1 point. Follow instructions.
- o **Projects:** graded with a rubric
- o **Sketchbooks:** It will be graded near the end of the term. Provide your own. You can purchase one from me; pay \$1 to the book keeper and bring me a receipt. You have the option to make one.
- o **Informal assessments:** Tracked with a chart that you will glue in your sketchbook.
- o Cleaning: Tracked with a chart that you will glue in your sketchbook.
- <u>Homework</u>: Homework is whenever you do not finish something by the due date. Get it done within 5 days from the due date.
- <u>Late work:</u> You have natural consequences if you get your assignments turned in late. I will accept all work until the
 end of the term.
- o Extra credit: Options will be posted on my website. You can earn up to 200 points extra credit.
- o <u>Citizenship Grades:</u> H=Honorable, S=Satisfactory, N=Needs Improvement, U=Unsatisfactory

More

o <u>Hall Pass:</u> Ask me, sign out, take hall pass, sign in and only one at a time. You cannot use the hall pass during listening time; emergencies are exceptions. I encourage you to use the hall pass after you finish the goal written on the white board & I stamp your chart.

- o <u>Materials/Costs</u>: Pay the book keeper the class fee. The fee covers the necessary materials to complete assignments. Provide your own sketchbook (or make one in class), pencil, and apron.
 - Students will get an art kit that includes: a blending stump, a shading pencil, a drawing pencil, a small eraser, a block eraser, a kneaded eraser, crayons, a sharpener and a pen. If a supply is lost and you need another one, you will owe the cost of the supply.
 - Optional printing will cost extra (.25 bk/wht, .50 color).
 - o If supplies are borrowed and not returned, you will owe the cost of the supply.
 - o I will keep a form list throughout the semester with your signature of the amounts you owe. Pay the book keeper a few weeks near the end of the semester of the total amount you owe & bring me a receipt.
- <u>Computers</u>: Please ask permission if you want to use the computers for a different reason than art class. No drinks and food near computers.
- Appropriate: Due to the nature of art and art history, images and/or controversial messages may be seen; however, I
 make every effort to censor content appropriate for high school students. Students are expected to do the same.
- Staying after: Please ask me permission the day you want to stay after; there are some days you won't be able to stay. You can only stay if you are working. You need to sign in when you come and sign out when you leave.
